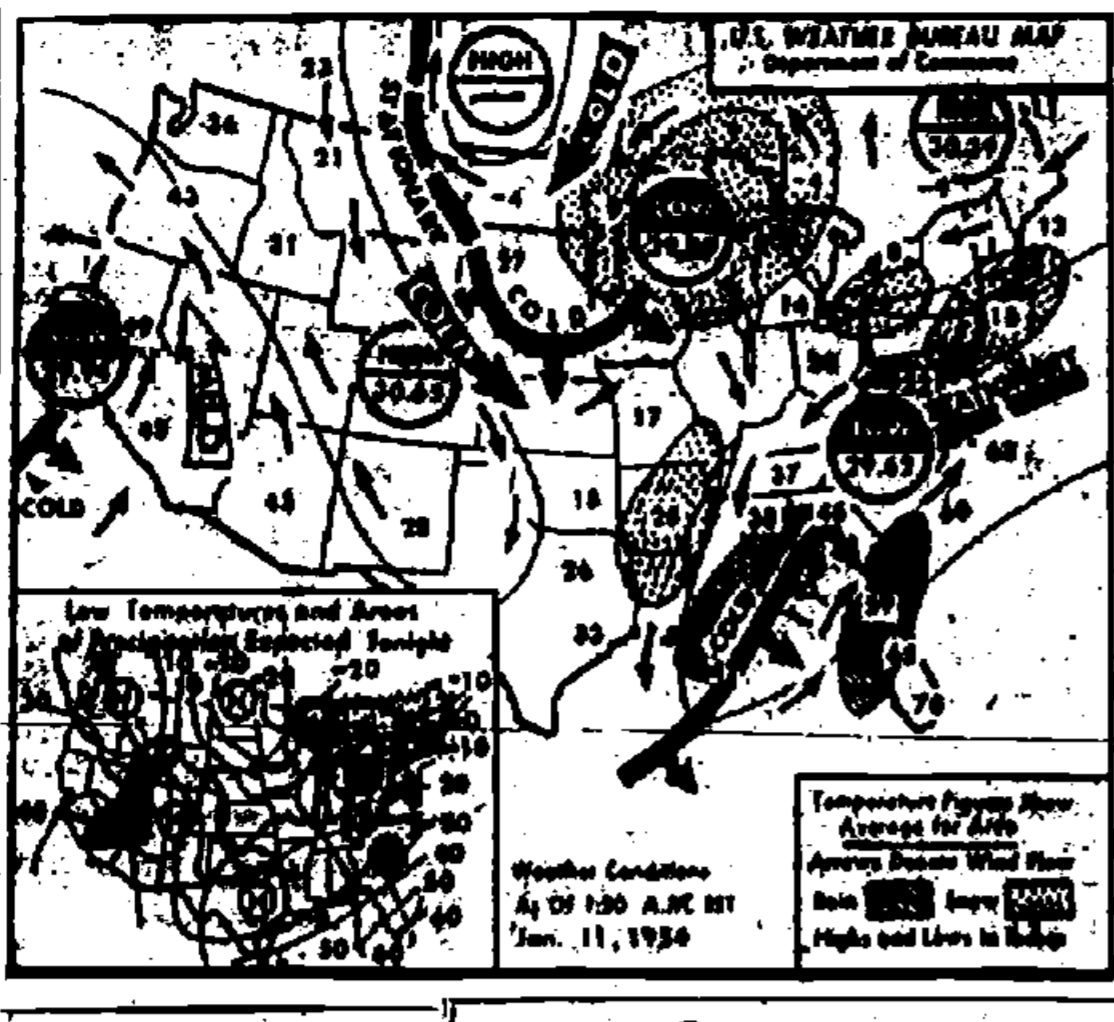


Hit-and-Run Driver Strikes Clinton Boy
