State grants totaling more than \$75,000 have been approved for social service agencies in Oneida and Herkimer counties to combat juvenile delinquency, the state Division for Youth said yesterday.

Leonard G. Dunston, director, said the grants -- part of an \$11 million package statewide - can he used to reimburse up to 100 percent of costs for programs nmed at abating youth unemployment, teen pregnancy, dropping cut of school and suicide.

The largest single grant in the \$34,000 will go to Utica Community Action, Inc., 214 Rutger St.

Rose White, director of the Oneida County Youth Burgay, which was instrumental in obtaining the grant, said the agency offers counseling and educational programs for high risk youth, itive youth development."

The Utica YW.CA also was earmarked for a \$4,000 grant to support its rape crisis and child abuse prevention program.

Other grants to be administered by the Youth Bureau of Herkimer County include General Herkimer Council. Boy Scouts of America, \$4,900; Herkimer County Hel-pline, Inc., \$7,000; Catholic Fami-& Community Services. Herkimer, \$5,000: Family Services of Greater Utics, \$14,074; YMCA of the Mohawk Valley, Mohawk, \$1.500, and Herkimer County Association for Retarded Citizens.


