592 HUNTING LICENSES GIVEN BY TOWN CLERK

Seventy-one more licenses for hunting have been issued by Town Clerk Frank Clark this year than in 1935. Mr. Clark has given out a total of 59 deer permits and 433 regular licenses for hunting, fishing and trapping. The former figure is ten above the 1935 amount and the latter numbers 61 more than a year ago.

The number of persons obtaining permits in advance of the season was about the same as in 1935, but over the week-end an unprecedented rush prevailed.

Each applicant received a fish and game syllabus calling attention to the fact that deer season closes November 15.

Rules permit a hunter to take only one deer during the season and the victim must be a buck with horns at least three inches long. Use of jacklights, spotlights, salt licks, traps or dogs is forbidden and each carcass of a buck brought out of the woods must be properly tagged.

The pheasant season runs for two weeks and only male birds may be taken. Not more than two birds may be killed on any day and not more than six during the open season.
