Father Imhoff was born in Utica, January 10, 1897, a son of Joseph and Louisa Franz Imhoff. He was educated in St. Joseph School and entered the Franciscan Order in 1914. He was Ordained to the Priesthood May 21, 1921 in Rome, Italy and also prior to his Ordination he received his Doctorate in Sacred Theology in Rome.

Father Imhoff served many Parishes of the Eastern Providence of the Franciscan Fathers in both the U.S. and Canada. He was also at one time a Professor at the Franciscan Seminary at Rensselaer. From 1934-1936 he was the Chaplain for St. Elizabeth Hospital in Utica, Father Imhoff was a Chaplain in the U.S. Army from 1942-1946 with Combat Duty in the European Theatre of Operations. He retired from Parish work about 12 years ago and made his home in Tampa, Fla., where he assisted in many local parishes in that area. He returned to the Seminary in Rensselaer a few months ago.
