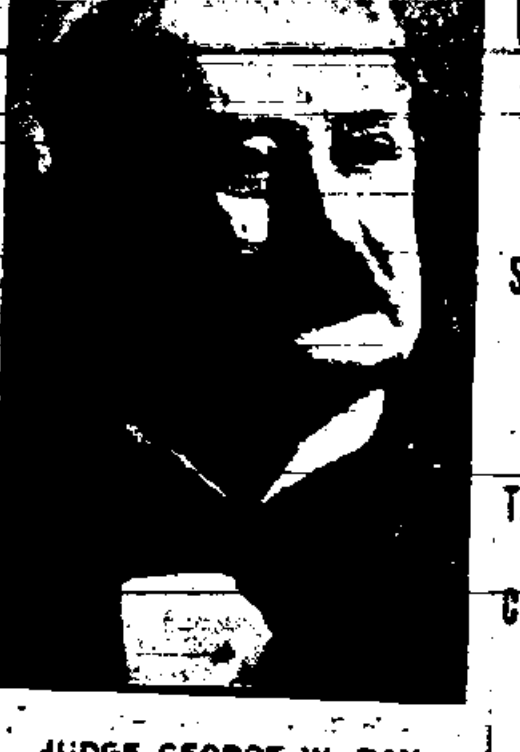

Judge Ray was appointed in 1902 to the position of judge of the court in the town of Norwich, N. Y.

Born in Otsele

Upon returning from war he started reading law in the office of E. H. Prindle of Norwich.

He was elected to Congress in 1904 and served as chairman of the committee on the judiciary.

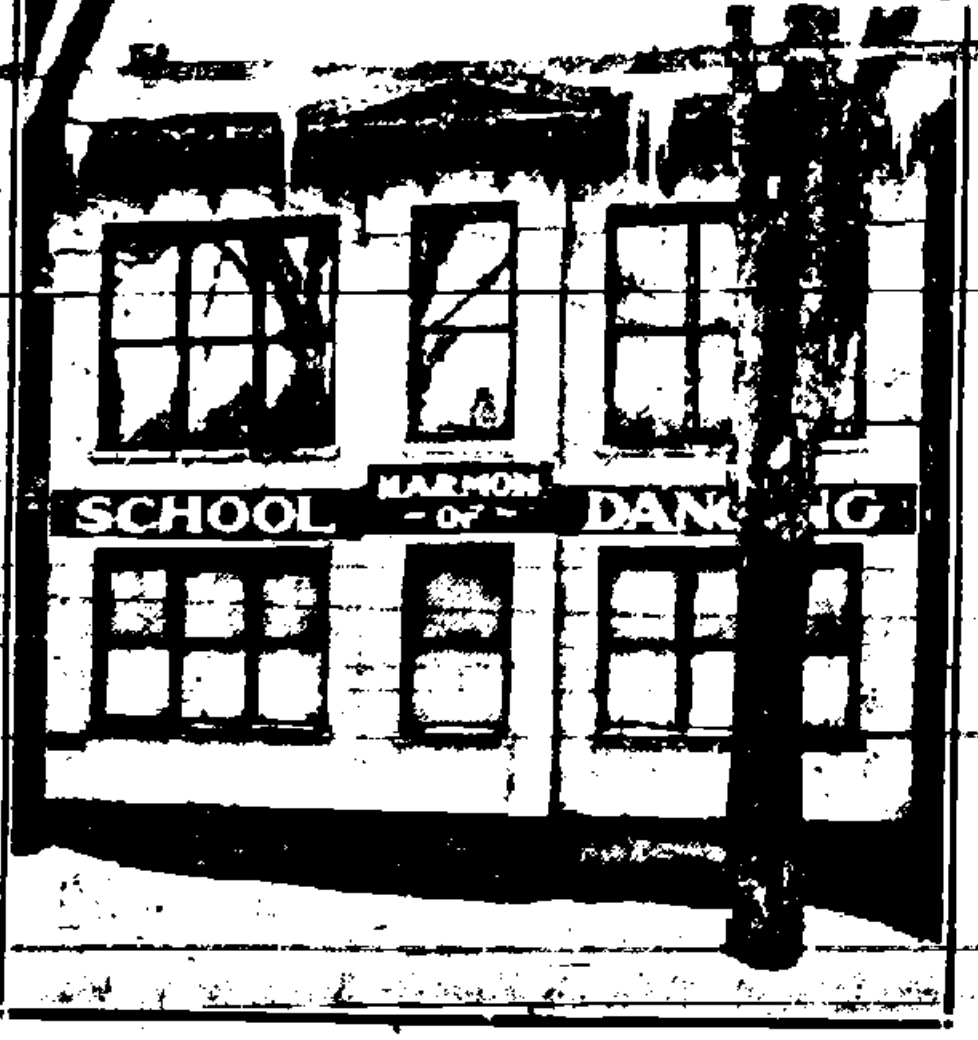
Some of the greatest pains of the country have been heard by Judge Ray, whose decisions were never reversed by upper courts.
