He married Rose Landry in 1909 in Whitesboro.

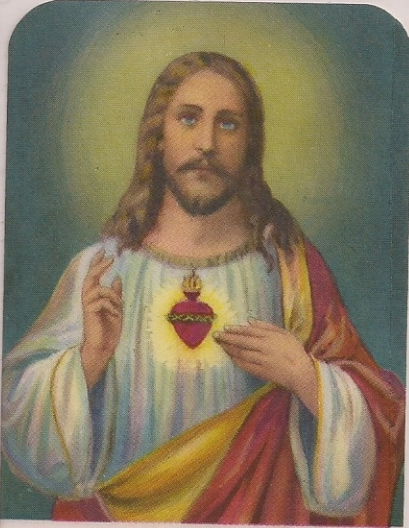
Besides his wife, he leaves four sons, Peter,
