

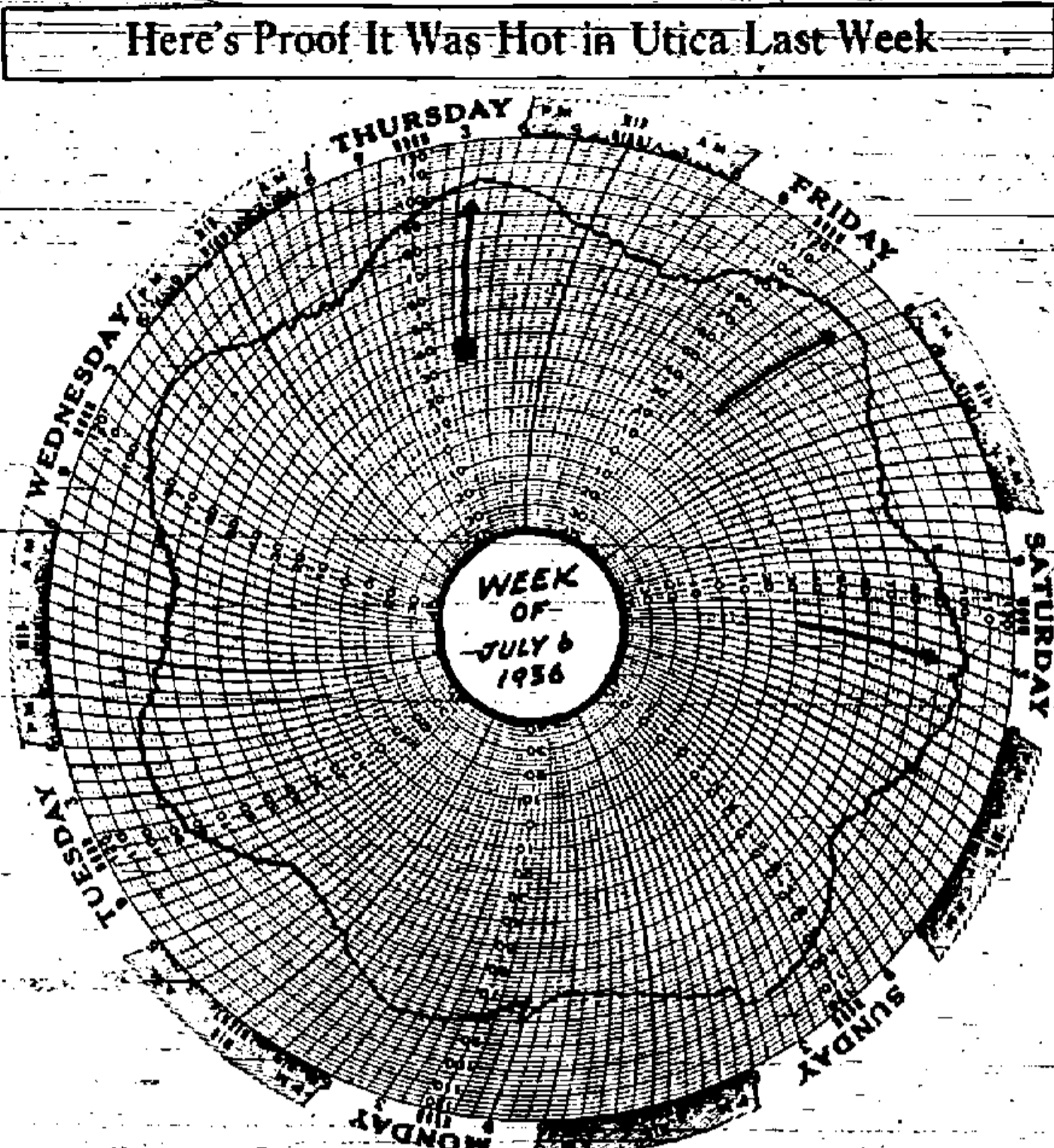
# Cooler Weather and Possible Showers Anticipated in Utica

## Mercury Once More Advances into 90s in Spite of Cloudy Sky

### Temperatures Drop Below 70 During Early Morning Hours for First Time in Week — Humidity Adds to Discomfort

Utica. Hopefully anticipated that promised rush of cool air from the West, which is expected to bring thunder showers and probably cooler tonight. In the meantime the heat wave, which began a week ago tomorrow, and broke all records for this vicinity, rolled merrily along with the mercury up again in the early part of the morning.

Weather the cool breeze and rains from the West will be expected to bring New York State a new record of congenial weather. Latest Weather Bureau advisory indicated that the cool wave is being dispersed or broken up on its passage across the western part of the nation.
