OBITUARY

GEORGE HOPP, SR.

George Hopp, Sr., 83, died unexpectedly March 2, 1956, at the home of his son, George C. Hopp, Utica Street.

He was born August 16, 1872, in New London, son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Paul Hopp. He was educated in the New London school and, for many years, was a well-known contractor and builder. In Utica, he was connected with the Hopp and Down Co. He constructed several of the largest textile mills in Utica.

On July 15, 1895, he married Bertha Carle, Utica. She died October 9, 1948. He had lived in Clinton nine years, prior to which he lived in New York Mills and Utica.

He was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Utica, and Liberty Lodge 959, F.&A.M.

Surviving are two sons, George C. Hopp, Clinton, and John W. Hopp, North Syracuse; a sister, Mrs. Elizabeth Eckhardt, New York Mills; five grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren; and one niece.

The funeral was at 10 Monday from the Owens Funeral Home, College Street, Clinton, with the Rev. Robert Nelson of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, officiating. Burial was in White Chapel Cemetery, DeWitt.

BARTHOLOMEW QUINN

Bartholomew Quinn, 79, of Kirkland, a veteran of the Spanish-American War and an employee of the Langdon & Hughes Electrical Co. Inc. of Utica when the firm started in business, died March 3, 1956 in a Utica hospital after a three-month illness.

Mr. Quinn was born July 21, 1876 in Kirkland, a son of Thomas F. and Alice Houston Quinn. He was employed all his life by Langdon & Hughes, retiring 23 years ago.

He married Mary L. Hauscher July 22, 1908 in St. Agnes Church, Vernon Center. They moved to Utica after their marriage and returned to Kirkland about 1935.

Mrs. Quinn died three years ago. Mr. Quinn served in the U. S. Volunteers Infantry in the Spanish-American War and was a corporal in Co "C" 28th U. S. Volunteers Infantry. He saw duty in the Philippines.

He was a communicant of the Church of the Annunciation, Clark Mills, and was a member of E. H. Liscum-O. Ross Wheeler Camp 38, United Spanish War Veterans, Utica; the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 181; the Holy Name Society of the Church of the Annunciation, and the Third Order of St. Francis.
